



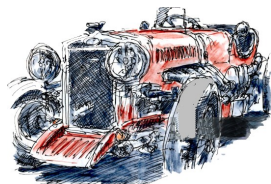

My first vehicle was a 1947 Ford 1/2t pick up my Dad bought for \$10 and gave to me when I was 14 year old. He and I restored over the next winter.

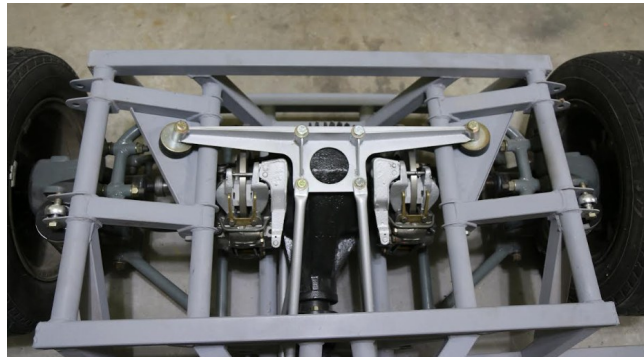
In 1971, at 15 years old I bought a 1965 Comet Caliente, black on white with bucket seats, 289 and 4-speed.

50/50 Draw -Draw Marilyn and Roger sold \$85 of tickets.

Financials- Bill Grace has provided an initial summary of the BOTB financials, however there will be some further fine tuning with a few more expenses and additions to be logged.

The club has now received its share of the \$10,000 to the sum of \$2,153.11 as the additional funding from the main branch for the membership totals as of Nov. 2025.

Membership- Farrell VanderRee reported a recent increase in the memberships bringing us to a new total of 94 members. (From the BOTB event this produced 7 new or renewed members).

Website- July's newsletter The Bulletin– by George Roberts will be out later in the month with these minutes included, as well a selection of photos plus a rundown of our 24th year of BOTB 2026. George is always on the lookout for more content material, news, stories, articles etc. Our website guru John Weir had mentioned that our space we pay for our CIB branch website is limited in storage capacity and before we can make further updates, we may have to purge some of the older material, this will involve Gerry's input so awaiting his return from vacation.

Social Media-Julie updates the Facebook OECC with regular CIB event posts.

Regalia-Marilyn reported an extremely good result in sales and interest from BOTB, the results are as follows: Regalia sold \$516, Leather goods \$46, Donations \$11 and Memberships \$175.

BOTB- Firstly let me say I believe everything went off smoothly thanks to Julie's excellent planning and all the help from the contributing members. I would like to share this time to reflect on how we did and areas of improvement for next year, which will be our special 25th year, so what are we going to do differently? These are the topics for review:

Bob Marineau of Prime-Time DJ music, sound system for the site – Excellent sound quality, perhaps obtain more wireless speakers for the distant field coverage. (May incur more cost next year due to rental equipment required) current cost \$630.

People's choice award – well received, basket gift and award plaque.

Silent gift basket auction (6) – Had a very poor response, lots of work for little reward. Needs a rethink, next year obtain raffle licence for 2 draws morning and afternoon.

50/50 Draw- Next year have 2 draws a morning and afternoon draw. Current intake \$604.50

Kids Passports - Well received, continue with no changes.

Parts Table Sales - Well received, continue with no changes, generated \$262

Online vehicle reservation system - Well received, continue with no changes.

Advertising with Facebook and the local 'Take 5' magazine – We think provided good coverage and worth the expenditure of \$265.65

First aid station – great no change cost \$259

Washrooms –We feel what's available on site is adequate.

Discussion topic:

Did British Motor Corporation (BMC) or the later British Leyland's famously named "Badge Engineered" vehicles really pay off or was a step too far?

For example, take the Pinin Farina designed A55, it morphed into five different marques; the Austin Cambridge Mark II, Morris Oxford Mark V, Wolseley 15/60, Riley 4/68 and MG Midget Mark III, all produced between 1959-1961 and somewhat competing against each other in the market.

Although the practice gained the name "Badge Engineering", in most cases it was by far more than this. There were significant differences between the five vehicles. Some had complete front end body panel and grille changes along with interior trim appointments, engine modifications and varying 2 tone paint schemes. This would obviously create some significant scheduling headaches for the factory with mixed parts, timing, storage, and handling. So, with this logistical nightmare to overcome, why did the manufacturer decide to go on this route? (A far cry from the famous words of Henry Ford, you can have any colour you like as long as it is black). Also remember, this is well before any computerization was implemented in manufacturing to help sequence things.

Was it because the management thought they could sell more units at different price points: Austin and Morris range for the average working class, sportier man for the MG marque, and for the higher-class establishment the more appointed Wolseley and Riley models?

This would also align well with the long-established special marque garages that existed to have the cars, auto parts and service to sell. As earlier in the history of these vehicles, they would have been their own separate manufacturers prior to amalgamation.

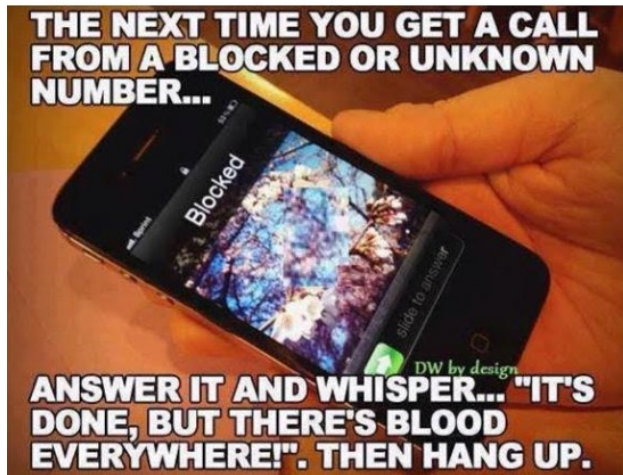

This 1961 Austin-Healey "Bugeye" Sprite, said by the seller to be a first-place, show-winning example, is reported to have gone through a "no-expense-spared, nut-and-bolt, body-off, concours-quality restoration." Additionally, the Healey's original 948-cc inline-four was supplanted by a 1,275-cc BMC A-Series powerplant—a common upgrade for "Bugeye" Sprites. Showing like new, inside and out—as well as underneath—the "Bugeye" has been driven just over 880 miles since the restoration was completed.

FEATURES

- The subject of a comprehensive restoration, the Bugeye shows like new.
- The Sprite's BMC A-Series 1,275-cc OHV inline-four replaced the original 948-cc four.
- The engine's quoted output is 65 horsepower and 72 lb-ft of torque.
- The four-speed manual transmission is said to be an updated unit as well.
- No maladies are noted for the front-engine/rear-drive powertrain.
- Brake lines, exhaust system, and driveline mechanisms are new and factory correct.
- Headlights are new from Lucas, as are all wiring and electrical components.
- The Sprite's Iris Blue finish is said to be a respray in the original color.
- All brightwork has been polished to a chrome-like finish.
- The blue convertible top and Plexiglas side curtains are said to function as intended.
- Interior components present well, with no malfunctions cited.
- Steering, suspension, and braking systems are without complaints.
- The steel wheels and their hubcaps show well in the photos.

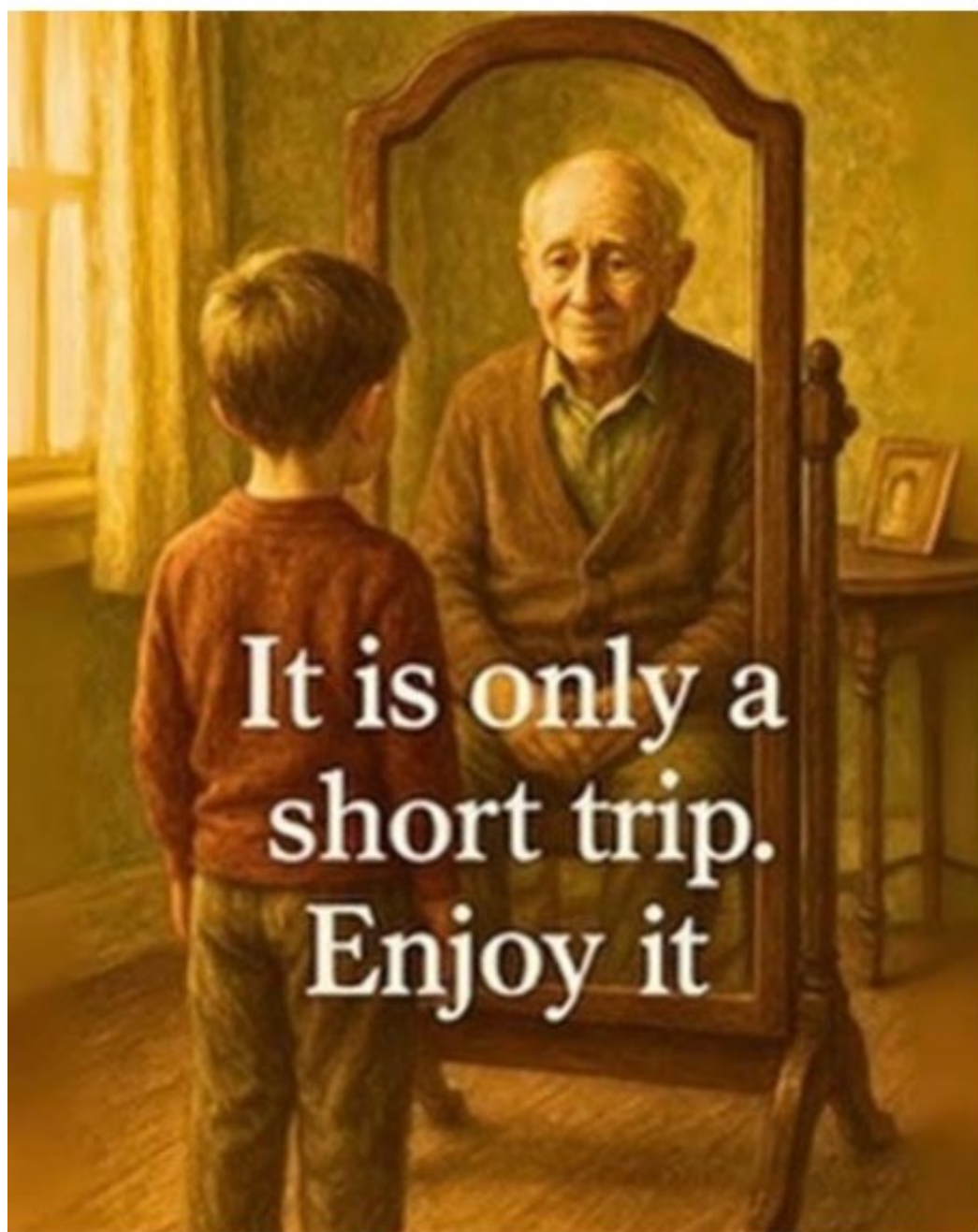
